## Leschi PTA Community Meeting 9/21/2022

- Welcome, Land and Redlining Acknowledgement Ricole and Dana
  - Dana welcomed people to the meeting (6:41pm)
  - Dana introduced herself co-Secretary, son Julian in 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade
  - Ricole introduced herself co-VP, son Roman is in 4<sup>th</sup> grade
  - o Ricole gave land acknowledgment
  - Dana gave redlining acknowledgment
  - Community Agreements
    - Be mindful that everyone here is in service of school community and collective good. Stay curious and stay in relationship. Ask questions.
    - Be mindful of power dynamics. Racial bias is part of these spaces, be mindful we are making space for people of color to participate in the meeting.

- Short Overview of PTA values/priorities and activities Carley
  - Values
    - Health safety and education of all kids
    - Confronting and dismantling systemic racism
    - Welcome all voices regardless of official membership, or can engage folks individually and represent those voices
  - PTA Opportunities and Activities Three big categories
    - School and staff support
      - i..e funding school supplies, buying treats, field trips, organizing volunteers
    - Family support
      - Working with family support staff (previously Mr. Donaldson, now Ms. Miller)
      - Collecting food and distributing, especially during breaks
      - Thanksgiving meals
      - Giving garland
      - Scholarships for enrichment activities
    - Building community
      - Spirit wear
      - Signs

- First event will be soon, Fall Festival with Taste of Leschi
  - Families can bring food to share and there will be fall-themed activities.
  - October 6, 4-7pm
  - Looking for volunteers
- Lots of ways to get involved, will have stations later for people to sign up
- Vote on PTA rules Erin P
  - o Erin P presented the votes we need to do in the general meeting
  - Budget amendment: \$5,000 that PTA had budgeted to support 5<sup>th</sup> grade camp is no longer needed because Principal Liu got a grant to cover those costs. Proposal is to add the \$5,000 to the school supplement budget to provide more money for tutors (based on need identified by Principal Liu).
  - Motion to increase school supplement to \$30,000 (from \$25,000)
    - Passed unanimously
  - Motion to adopt the <u>Standing Leschi PTA rules</u>
    - Passed unanimously.
- Principal Liu presentation and Q&A Community meeting slides 9-21-22.pdf
  - o Has been a relatively smooth start to the school year
  - Apologies for transportation difficulties. Hopefully that will get figured out very soon.
  - A lot of deeper collaboration anticipated as a staff this year
  - A lot of new staff and will send out a slideshow of staff teams so families can get to know folks
  - Snack will now be scheduling snack time in the classroom, teachers will be asking for donations (nut-free and gelatin-free)
  - Arrival and dismissal: families can continue to be on the playground during those times to continue to assist in transition
  - Waitlists available for some after-school care. Central Area Youth Association and Holgate Street Church of Christ have openings. Transportation is available (van)
    - Can sign up at school
  - Curriculum night Thursday October 13 from 6-7pm, in-person event
    - Evening before scheduled in-service day
    - Classroom presentation 6-6:30pm
    - 10 minutes for families to move to lunchroom
    - Then 6:40 Mr. Liu will present schoolwide expectations

- Will look into childcare options, but kids not expected to attend
- Question about how it will work if families have 2 or more kids in different classes
  - Mr. Liu will get back to us on that
- Schoolwide Expectations
  - Teachers will be teaching lessons on schoolwide expectations
  - Posters will be put up throughout school
  - Quiet coyote (or silent slug) will be the schoolwide quiet signal
  - Schoolwide assemblies for students on Monday the 26<sup>th</sup>
  - Question: will this also include expectations on how adults will treat students?
    - Yes, we will have adult expectations based on "Tier 1" (formerly PBIS)
- o Mr. Liu shared some poster examples
- Questions/interest in lunchroom expectations
  - A lot of challenges and shifting expectations last year due to COVID.
  - Not showing movies, now able to speak (voice level 2 normal speaking voice).
  - Staff is there encouraging kids to eat
- Voice level chart, voice level expectations in different scenarios from 0 to 4
  - 0 = silent; 1 = whisper; 2 = normal speaking; 3 = loud, presentation voice;
    4 = shouting
- Bringing back Pup Pride tickets given out to students who are following expectations.
  - Ticket drawings will take place in assemblies and include a non-food prize
  - Classes can also earn awards for expected hallway behavior and lunchroom behavior
- Open positions at the school
  - Math tutor (3-4 hours per day)
  - Preschool hourly support (3.5 hours per day)
  - Recess supervisor and literacy tutor (3.5 hours per day)
  - Kitchen Manager (6 hours per day)
    - Ms. Shelley retiring at the end of the month
    - Carley: should do staff appreciation for her!
- Questions
  - Ask to demonstrate the silent slug
  - Can parents come to lunch? Used to be allowed before pandemic

- Mr. Liu will find out if there are restrictions around that. Generally going back to pre-pandemic rules and partnerships.
- For example, will resume partnership between 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students and dance chance, also math tutoring
- What dates are the 5<sup>th</sup> grade camp?
  - Can't remember now, but it's not during mid-winter break.
- Thinking about possibly having school during mid-winter break during part of the week instead of going into July.
- For the expectations, are there special considerations for those who are not able to meet all those expectations
  - Yes, expectations
- For snack, should parents give just their kids a snack, or for everyone?
  - It's flexible, you can pack just for your kid, but teachers will have snack for everyone.
- Is there still an after school partnership for Elementary Instrumental Music?
  - It's a SPS program. Starting in October, instrumental instruction will happen on Monday mornings for upper grades.
  - Will also have a partnership with Seattle Jazz Ed. Looking into that for all students since we don't have a separate Music class.
- What happened to the music class time that was previously allotted? What is that time used for?
  - More P.E. and Art. Every class has 2 Art and 2 P.E. classes per week, and each class is 40 minutes long.
- Are you looking for volunteers for field trips? Yes!
- Teachers will be talking more about that during curriculum night. Can also go to SPS website to apply to be a volunteer.
- Stations: Separated into stations, people can visit and learn more about different opportunities, sign up to receive emails about them throughout the year (but not binding you to do anything)
  - Station 1: Dana/Alicia Family Support/giving garland/backpacks
  - Station 2: Kevin/Jasmine Advocacy
  - Station 3: Erin C/Kristin/Alexi Events, yearbook and enrichment, Taste of Leschi most urgently
  - Station 4: Benson/Andrea- PTA membership, positions, boards, etc
  - Station 5: Benson/Erin- fundraising (annual fund) and finance
  - Station 6: Erin H/Carley- teacher appreciation, communications and building support
  - Heather/Ricole- Spirit wear
